Graduate accounting students at Anderson have an opportunity to work with the white collar crime unit of either the Albuquerque Police Department or the Bernalillo County Sheriff’s Department.

Students are required to complete an application, be interviewed both internally (UNM) and externally (APD or BCSO) and have a background check.
